- 7. The surveyor's chain is with it.
- 8. It was brought from N. Carolina in 1806
 by one of the first Quaker colonists, Mr. Martin Marmon.
 He used it in survey of the Sandusky Trail, Zanesfield
 and surrounding country.
 It was presented in 1956 to the Logan County Historical
 Society by a descendant, Mr. Henry Marmon, of Boise Idaho.
- 9. It has an Outkeeper. (What is it's purpose?)
- 10. Yes, it may be photographed. (If you give us a print.)
 But it cannot be purchased at any price, being
 permanently dedicated to the people of Logan County.
