

Su 93 ANTIQUE SURVEY COMPASS & TRIPOD by Wm. L. Potts, PittsTown, New Jersey, 5½" dia. face, Vanes 6½" high. Brass, with needle and needle lock, cross bubbles working, crack in glass face (which could be replaced). In wood box and mounted on its original antique tripod. Similar to one shown in "The Makers of Surveying Instruments in America" by Charles Smart. He states "This is the second surveyor's vernier compass made by W.L. Potts that is known to exist." With this one there are now at least 3 known. This is probably the same man who produced instruments with Rittenhouse in Pennsylvania and there are "Rittenhouse and Potts" compasses known with photographs of them in the Gurley Museum. A rare find in American instruments.
