This unusual instrument is made of mahogany(?)

Upright sighting pieces drop in square end holes.
The glass has numerous fine scratches. I was told it
may be a replacement from a past repair.
The compass paper is etched or engraved with an inscription:
"Made by BENJ. WARREN PLYMOUTH NEW ENGD."
