## Description

Smallest C. L. Berger instrument made ca. 1910. Has 7 1/2 in. main tel. and 5 in. auxiliary tel. with counterpoise weight. The aux. tel. can be mounted either on top of the main scope or on the axle to the side. The reticle includes cross and stadia wires as well as two diagonal wires to prevent the misuse of the wrong wire when reading the rod. Has nickel silver vernier reflectors and 4 in. vertical limb w/ guard. In fitted mahogany case inside a thick harness leather outer case with straps for backpacking. This tiny instrument is sometimes called the expedition transit by another maker.

Notice to bidders: Included also with this instrument is its original tiny adjustable leg tripod. This is one of the rarest instruments produced in this country, because of its small size. Very few were made.
